

**MINUTES OF THE
SIXTH ANNUAL MEETING OF
THE MEMBER ORGANIZATIONS
OF THE
TEXAS ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT ATHLETIC ORGANIZATIONS**

The scheduled Annual Meeting of the TAI AO membership was called to order at 9:10 AM on June 15, 2019 in the La Quinta by Wyndham in Round Rock, Texas.

Authorized representatives of the following Member Organizations were in attendance, either in person or by proxy, representing a quorum: Austin Achieve Public Schools, Austin Classical School, Austin Royals, Boerne Area Christian Homeschoolers, Brazos Valley Christian Home Educators Association (BVCHEA), Family Educators Alliance of South Texas (San Antonio FEAST), Founders Classical Academy Leander, Full Armor Christian Academy (Henderson), Griffin School (Austin), Home Educators Athletics of Tyler (HEAT), Johnson County Sports Association (Joshua), KOR Education School (College Station), Mount Carmel Academy (Houston), Not Your Ordinary School (Round Rock NYOS), Texas Home Educators Sports Association (Ft. Worth THESA), Tribe Consolidated (Bastrop), Victoria Homeschool (Victoria), Williamson County Home School (WILCO, Round Rock), Wings Athletic Program (Corpus Christi), Winston School of San Antonio, The Clariden School, Southlake.

Wayne Alldredge acted as Chairman of the meeting and Rush Cone acted as Recording Secretary.

Mr. Alldredge opened the meeting with a prayer and welcomed the attendees and announced that a quorum of the Membership of the Association was present.

The first order of business was the election of three members to the TAI AO Steering Committee. The term of each Committee member elected will be for two years. The names of Monti Woolley, Michael Dagerath and Matt Dufner were placed in nomination for election to the Steering Committee. Upon motion made from the floor, all three were elected by unanimous acclamation.

For second order of business Rush Cone led a general discussion concerning three changes in the Association's General Rules. The changes were as follows:

- SubSection 247 C. 4. a. of the TAI AO General Rules is modified to mandate the disqualification from post season play by any team required to forfeit 50% or more of its regular season games, matches or contests. (See attached Exhibit A)
- SubSection 236 E. 2. of the TAI AO General Rules is modified with the addition of a new subsection c. to prioritize student athlete high school classification on the official roster by school classification first (when available); then by age second.
- SubSection 236 of the TAI AO General Rules is modified to require any student athlete 14 years of age or older, without a specific waiver from the Steering Committee, will be considered a High School athlete. This rule modification will be effective immediately and will be applied to all student

athletes new to the Member Organization for the 2019/2020 school year. All student athletes currently participating on a Member Organization team, including those who will be 14 years of age September 1, 2019 will not be affected by this rule for the duration of their High School eligibility. (Their eligibility is effectively grandfathered under the old rule.)" (See attached Exhibit C)

The third order of business was the Commissioner's report by Wayne Alldredge. Wayne began his report by handing out a packet of information and leading the discussion relating to the topics raised by the documents. (See attached Exhibit D) Thereafter, Mr. Alldredge provided his "state of the league" remarks.

As to the handout, Mr. Alldredge spoke to the following matters:

- Reviewed the 2nd Annual 6 Man Players Skills Camp and 1st Annual 6 Man Coaches Clinic and Camp scheduled for June 29, 2019 at University High School in Waco, Texas.
- Reviewed the General Rules requirement for each Member Organization to provide an annually signed TAI AO Rules Certification and Acknowledgement Form. The signed Form for the 2019/2020 school year is due by September 1, 2019.
- Reviewed the coach training and certification requirements of TAI AO General Rule 272 for the upcoming school year.
- Reviewed the current TAI AO Event Calendar for 2019/2020.
- Provided a spread sheet highlighting the sports and academic teams and events each Member Organization has committed to.
- Reviewed the TAI AO General Rules requirements related to student transfers and attached the current TAI AO Transfer Form.
- Reviewed the current TAI AO Financial Reports
 - The League is currently financially viable;
 - No increase in fees will be required; and,
 - We need to get better at budgeting for State Tournaments and Championship games.

As to his "state of the league" remarks, Mr. Alldredge commented on the following:

- League growth
 - Added 10 new organizations since last summer;
 - Have 4 additional organizations seriously considering joining; and,
 - For the first time most new members are not joining for football.
- League "maturity"
 - Likens the current league to a pre-teenager;
 - Some processes and events are working well; and,
 - Some are not and need attending to.
- League reputation
 - This is a highly important issue and is critical to League viability and growth;
 - Currently we have good relationships with TAPPs and TCAF;
 - Each Member Organization is key to maintaining this reputation.
- League challenges
 - To preserve long term leadership we need to plan for transition;

- We must strengthen our communication capabilities
 - The website must be completely revamped;
 - We will be hiring a website manager; and,
 - Will be getting customer management software.
- What we are doing right
 - We continue to grow in membership;
 - We are receiving positive comments on TAI AO state sponsored tournaments and events;
 - Haven't be required to recruit to grow in the past, but will begin to;
 - Will be seriously working to develop a plan to establish districts for some sports.

The fourth order of business was a presentation by Wayne Alldredge on behalf of Monty Wooley concerning concussion management. A concussion management protocol and guidelines are required for all sports activities by Texas state law. Each Member Organization must have a written protocol and guidelines. This is a significant liability issue for each Member Organization. If you need any assistance with this issue please contact THESA and/or Monti Wooley.

The fifth order of business was the following TAI AO Committee reports:

- Academic and Fine Arts Committee – by Matt Stiglich
Mr. Stiglich reported that the State Fine Arts meet is currently scheduled for April 4, 2020. Plans are to include music, art, speech and theater. He most needs help in development of a contact list for the Member Organizations. He also would like to fine a speech and drama advisor to help out. He currently is hoping to provide information for the website by August 31st.
- Baseball – by Skip Bradley
Mr. Bradley reviewed his philosophy on what rules to apply to the TAI AO State baseball tournament. He then reviewed the basics of the baseball plan which is to be posted to the TAI AO Website. The target date for posting is August 31st.
- Volleyball – by Stephanie Freund
Ms. Freund briefly reviewed the current Volleyball Plan and commented on the need for several changes. She plans to submit her recommended changes by mid-July. She discussed the need for a clearly defined set of rules applying to player uniforms. She requested the membership provide her with names of others willing to participate on the Volleyball Committee and help with getting Official Rosters in by the deadline. She also is seeking volunteers for the TAI AO State Volleyball Tournament which is scheduled for October 18th and 19th.
- Track & Field Committee – by Jeff Davis
Coach Davis reviewed the results of the first TAI AO only State track meeting. A smaller than hoped number of teams participated due to weather issues and the fact the original date for the meet had to be changed. The 2020 State meet is currently scheduled for the 3rd week in April. He also plans to propose some minor changes to the currently Track & Field Plan.
- Basketball Committee – by Bill Sharp

Coach Sharp reviewed 2019's TAIIO statewide tournament. Plans for the 2020 State tournament are already underway. The committee will continue to try to have a double elimination tournament. The 2020 State tournament will be at the same venue as last year. No changes to the current Basketball Plan are being proposed. He would like to see more TAIIO participation in this event.

- Football Committee – by Michael Crouch and Scott Diesing

Mr. Crouch reviewed important dates for the upcoming season. Current Committee plans are to again use MaxPreps for team seeding for state playoffs. Division alignment will again be a sliding scale based on Official Roster count with 50% of participating teams being assigned to each division. Current plans are to develop a map with location of each team and to begin the process of trying to set up districts.

- Cross Country – by Jim Bright (Ft. Worth THESA)

Mr. Bright reviewed the current program and informed the membership that the TAIIO sponsored state meet is currently planned for October 25th.

- Soccer – by Mike Franz

Current plans are to have another spring league and to sponsor a TAIIO State tournament.

As no further business was brought before the meeting, the meeting was adjourned by motion duly made and seconded at 2:00 PM.

EXHIBIT “A”

**MODIFICATION TO
SUBSECTION 247 (PENALTIES) C. 4. a.
SUBCHAPTER I (DISCIPLINE, PROTESTS & APPEALS)
OF THE TAI AO GENERAL RULES**

This change applies to forfeiture of 50% of more of a season’s contests.

SECTION 247 – PENALTIES

A. Penalties a TAI AO Committee Can Impose. Subject to provisions below, the following constitute the penalties that may be imposed by a TAI AO Committee following a determination of a violation of the TAI AO Constitution, General Rules, and policies and procedures.....

C. For Member Organizations. The penalties that may be imposed by the TAI AO Committee on a Member Organization for violations by its student representative, fans, patrons or personnel, of ethics, sportsmanship codes, eligibility rules, contest plans or reporting practices are: private reprimand, public reprimand, probation, forfeiture of contest, disqualifications from germane activity, and suspension recommended.....

4. Forfeiture of Contest.

a. Minimum penalty for ineligible contestant. The involved TAI AO Committee shall forfeit the contest won by the individual or Member Organization as a minimum penalty, if it finds that an individual contestant was not eligible to participate in the contestgame, meet and/or contest. In addition, if the percentage of games, meets and /or contests forfeited by the Member Organization is 50% or more of the season in question, the minimum penalty shall also include disqualification of the Member Organization in TAI AO playoffs and/or TAI AO state sponsored events for the sport and year in question.

EXHIBIT “B”

MODIFICATION TO SUBSECTION 236 E. (ELIGIBILITY) SUBCHAPTER G (ELIGIBILITY) OF THE TAI AO GENERAL RULES

This rule change requires a student pursuing dual credit to be bound by the highest grade classification. (Cannot participate as a freshman if pursuing dual credit as a sophomore).

SECTION 236 - ELIGIBILITY

E. Four Year Rule:

1. Except as otherwise provided, a student is allowed up to 4 consecutive years of eligibility to participate in TAI AO at the High School level,
2. A student is allowed less than 4 consecutive years of eligibility to participate in TAI AO at the High School level in the following situations:
 - a. **Advanced Age:** A student participating at the High School level for the first time who is older than 15 years as of September 1st will have his/her years of eligibility reduced by 1 year for each year beyond 15 years of age. (For example, a student who will be 17 years of age as of September 1st will be limited to 2 years of High School level participation.)
 - b. **First Official Roster Designation:** ~~a~~A student’s eligibility to participate at the High School level will be limited to his/her first official classification on a Member Organization’s Roster for a particular sport, competition or event. (For example, a student participating for the first time who is listed as a sophomore will only have 3 years of eligibility, including the sophomore year, regardless of age.)
 - c. **Eligibility Limited by Academic Classification:** The High School eligibility of a student participating in dual or simultaneous credit will be limited to the higher classification by (i) the student’s Member Organization and (ii) by any school (public or private), college, university, trade school or other technical training or educational organization in which the student is enrolled for dual or simultaneous credit or the attainment of academic or vocational credit. (For example, a student listed as a

sophomore by his/her Member Organization but who is listed as a junior by a school he/she is seeking dual credit will only have 2 years of eligibility, including the current year, regardless of age.)

EXHIBIT “C”

MODIFICATION TO SECTION 236 (ELIGIBILITY) SUBCHAPTER G (ELIGIBILITY) OF THE TAI AO GENERAL RULES

Hard Rule Changes to (i) limit 14 year olds participating at Middle School Level and (ii) to establish grade classification by an academic institution (when available) as controlling eligibility.

The changes will be effective as of the 2019/2020 school year for all student athletes new to a TAI AO Member Organization. All student athletes who participated on a TAI AO Member Organization team during the 2018/19 school year or students new to the TAI AO Member Organization in the 2019/2020 school year that have completed the organizations registration procedures and have participated in the organizations spring and/or summer practices prior to June 30, 2019 will be grandfathered under the old rule for the remainder of their High School Eligibility.

SECTION 236 - ELIGIBILITY

A. Age Requirements.

1. Article VI Section 2. of the Constitution shall control the upper age limit of students eligible to participate.
2. Except as provided in Subsection A. 3. below, a student will be considered a High School student who is 14 years of age or older as of September 1st in the year of participation.
3. **Playing Down.** From time to time a Member Organization may seek permission from the Steering Committee to authorize a student who will be 14 years of age on September 1st in the current year of participation to “play down” at the Middle School level and not initiate his/her High School eligibility. The Steering Committee will be guided in its decision by the following:
 - a. The safety of the student in question and those against whom he/she may compete,
 - b. The ability of the Member Organization to participate in the sport in question at the Middle School level,
 - c. The prior history of the Member Organization and/or its coaches and other representatives in complying with the Rules, Regulations and Requirements of TAI AO, and;
 - d. Such other factors or guidelines as the Steering Committee may implement from time to time....

E. Four Year Rule:

1. Except as otherwise provided, a student is allowed up to 4 consecutive years of eligibility to participate in TAI AO at the High School level,
2. Initial classification (as a Freshman, Sophomore, Junior or Senior) of a student participating at the High School level for the first time will be determined by the grade level assigned to the student by any academic institution attended by the student during the current Year of Participation. In the event the student is not enrolled in any academic institution at that time, initial classification of the student will be established by his/her age as of September 1st of the current Year of Participation.
3. A student is allowed less than 4 consecutive years of eligibility to participate in TAI AO at the High School level in the following situations:
 - a. **First Official Roster Designation:** A student's eligibility to participate at the High School level will be limited to his/her first official classification on a Member Organization's Roster for a particular sport, competition or event. (For example, a student participating for the first time who is listed as a sophomore will only have 3 years of eligibility, including the sophomore year, regardless of age.)
 - b. **Advanced Age:** A student participating at the High School level for the first time who is older than 14 years as of September 1st will have his/her years of eligibility reduced by 1 year for each year beyond 14 years of age. (For example, a student who will be 16 years of age as of September 1st will be limited to 2 years of High School level participation.)

F. Younger Students: Due to safety concerns;

1. No student 13 years or younger as of September 1st in the year of participation may play on any TAI AO High School team.

G. Middle School:

1. **Age Requirements.** Except as otherwise provided in subsection A. 3. Above, participation in TAI AO sponsored Middle School activities, events and contests, other than football, shall be open to students who;
 - a. Will reach their 10th birthday no later than September 1st in the year of participation; and,
 - b. Will not have reached their 14th birthday earlier than September 1st of the same year.
 - c. Participation in football will require
 - i. The student to have reached their 11th birthday no later than September 1st in the year of participation; and,
 - ii. Will not have reached their 14th birthday earlier than September 1st of the same year.
2. **Four/Three Year Rule.** In sports other than football, Students may have up to four consecutive years of eligibility at the Middle School level. Football participation will be limited to up to three consecutive years of eligibility.

3. A Member Organization may adopt eligibility rules related to Middle School participation that are more stringent than TAI AO rules for eligibility (including academic eligibility).
4. Questions concerning eligibility shall be referred to the TAI AO Committee providing oversight for the contest, event or activity in question for review and a decision...

TAIAO ANNUAL TRAINING REMINDER

A reminder that all organizations must have coaches that have completed the Biannual training present at all practices, games, meets, contests:

General Rules Section 272:

A. All TAIAO head coaches are required to complete the following NFHS Courses by August 1st of the first year of participation in TAIAO and every second year thereafter:

1. Core Courses:

- a. *Fundamentals of Coaching*; and,
- b. *First Aid, Health and Safety for Coaches*

2. Additional Course:

- a. *Concussion in Sports*

B. All TAIAO coaches and other staff are strongly encouraged to complete at least every other year training courses or clinics related to the following:

1. *Heat Acclimatization*: Education and training related to utilization of available professional development tools regarding proper approach to Heat Acclimatization.
2. *Sportsmanship*: Education and training related to utilization of available professional development tools regarding proper approach to Sportsmanship, how it impacts the educational process and your specific role in promoting it at all interscholastic athletic events.

C. Any coach will be deemed to have met the certification requirements of Subsection 272.A above upon successful completion of courses of a substantially similar nature required by that coach's Member Organization.

D. A coach certified as having completed the requirements of Subsection 272.A above must be in attendance at all events, contests, games and matches of the Member Organization regardless of whether or not against a TAIAO opponent.
